


STEPS & SKIPS

Music moves in one of 3 ways:

- 1. It stays on the same pitch.
- 2. It moves up or down by a step to the neighboring line or space.
- 3. It moves by skipping up or down by more than one step.

The songs on pages 1 and 2 have no skips. These songs have skips, steps, and repeated notes.



These songs are in the key of G major. There is one sharp indicated in the key signature. Songs in G major usually end on G. It is the most important note and is called the tonic.

PURCHASING A RECORDER
